AN ORDINANCE to ordain Section 66-210 of the Code of the City of New Orleans to impose certain limitations regarding loudspeakers and amplified noise; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto.

SECTION 1. THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW ORLEANS HEREBY ORDAINS, That Section 66-210 of the Code of the City of New Orleans is hereby ordained to

3 read as follows:

4 "Sec. 66-210. LOUDSPEAKERS AND AMPLIFIERS

- 5 (a) A person commits an offense if the person operates or causes to be operated any
- 6 mechanical loudspeaker or sound amplifier in a public place or upon any public sidewalk,
- street, alley, or right of way of the city in violation of any of the following limitations and
 requirements:
- 9 (1) A mechanical loudspeaker or sound amplifier must be operated so as not to cause
 10 traffic congestion or congregation of crowds that obstructs any public sidewalk,
- 11 street, alley, or right of way.
- 12 (2) A mechanical loudspeaker or sound amplifier may not be operated within 150 feet13 of the property line of any:
- 14 (A) hospital;

15	(B) nursing home; or
16	(C) medical/dental clinic, as defined by the Comprehensive Zoning
17	Ordinance of the City of New Orleans, or any facility that provides
18	surgical services to patients who do not require overnight hospital care
19	during the hours of operation of the facility.
20	(b) If conduct that would otherwise violate this section consists of speech or other
21	communication, of gathering with others to hear or observe such speech or
22	communication, or of gathering with others to picket or otherwise express in a nonviolent
23	manner a position on social, economic, political, or religious questions, the person must
24	be ordered to move, disperse, or otherwise remedy the violation prior to their arrest or
25	citation.
26	(c) The order required by subsection (b) may be given by a peace officer, a fireman, a person
27	with authority to control the use of the premises, or any person directly affected by the
28	violation.
29	(d) It is a defense to prosecution under subsection (a) that:
30	(1) in circumstances in which this section requires an order no order was given;
31	(2) an order, if given, was manifestly unreasonable in scope;
32	(3) an order, if given, was promptly obeyed;
33	(4) the mechanical loudspeaker or sound amplifier was operated in a public place
34	within an enclosed structure and was not audible beyond the property line of the
35	premises on which it was located;

36	(5) the person operating the mechanical loudspeaker or sound amplifier was a law
37	enforcement officer or member of the fire department in the performance of
38	official duties;
39	(6) the mechanical loudspeaker or sound amplifier was operated for the purpose of
40	alerting persons to the existence of an emergency or danger; or
41	(7) the mechanical loudspeaker or sound amplifier was operated in the performance
42	of emergency work necessary to restore public utilities, to restore property to a
43	safe condition, or to protect persons or property from imminent danger, following
44	a fire, accident, or natural disaster."
